Presentation of Mid-Year Data.....Admin

- Reviewed learning objectives and agenda for meeting.
- Reviewed vision, mission, and belief statements. Many beliefs are connected to our school improvement plan.
- PMA help determine small group learning and remediation. Teachers also can request students to attend additional Lunch and Learn sessions. PMA 1 and 2 assess different standards.
- PMA 3 data set shows us where a student truly is.
- ELA 9 PMA #1 62.1% proficient. PMA #2 in the same category shows 60.1% profieciency.
- Grade 10 PMA #1 62.1% and PMA #2 73.3 proficient.
- Algebra 1 PMA #1 33% and PMA 2 at 43% proficient.
 - UNIT zero was implemented to support students who are missing many basic skills.
- Geometry PMA#1 42.6% and PMA 2 43%.
- Biology PMA #1 56.9% and PMA #2 50.2%
- US History PMA #1 50% and 51% on PMA #2.

- This PMA data does not include AP students.
- Comparative Data
 - ELA 9 21-22 school year is now more aligned with 19-20 school year.
 - Algebra 1 has not seen the same rebound as English and other academic categories.
- 21-22 school year achievement gap in English has closed the achievement gap some.
 - Math has not seen the same change in achievement gaps.
 - Teachers are reviewing data of which students need to receive remediation and additional support.
- Area of Focus: Teachers will participate in effective common planning. Core content will engage in standard aligned planning.
 - Evidence of progress is indicated by standards-based walk throughs. Weekly PLCS. Identify teachers who need support for standards-based learning.
 - Equivalent experience assessments occurred through English classes to better align.
- PLC is to show student products to discuss if an assignment is truly connecting with the standard. It is a collaborative practice that we have once a week.
- Build a culture of inclusivity and equity.
 - We have not yet met the goal. Many clubs have been ramped up specifically the Black Student Alliance. The Culture of Climate has been having activities. As well as support from PTSA. This is a stakeholder initiative.
