Uniform Policy Guidelines:

- Our Uniform Policy adheres to the requirements of the DCPS General Code of Appearance.
- All students in grades Pre-K through 5th are required to wear a uniform.
- Our Uniform Policy was adopted during the 2010-2011 school year.
- All students are expected to participate, and school uniforms must be worn daily.
- There is no "opt-out" policy regarding school uniforms.
- On Fridays, students are permitted to wear "Spirit Shirts". This includes "Purple-Up" shirts and "Spirit Shirts" from previous school years.
- In the event that students are unable to conform to the uniform policy set forth in this document, the following measures will be taken:
 - 1. Call home: Parents/caregivers will be given the option to bring the correct items to school, or the offer to have the student wear one of the extra uniforms we have on hand in the front office.
 - 2. A note will be sent home encouraging and reminding our parents/caregivers of the importance of following our uniform policy. Non-conformity will limit and possibly prevent students from receiving or participating in:
 - School clubs
 - Silver and Golden Anchor Award
