## Classroom Focus


With the curriculum change, the district has 6th graders reading *The Lightning Thief*.

Mrs. Pekarek recognized this would be a challenge because over 90% of her students had read it. To keep the material fresh, she turned the unit into a competition of "cabins." Students started by choosing a Greek god to research and then created the "cabin" for that god. The trick? The name of the god could not be visible, but it should be identifiable based on their creation. Students worked together, but the great part was that they worked together across classes! Mrs. Pekarek set the students up in a Team for their chosen god and students shared ideas, decided how they would proceed and then they would add to their project during their own class period. It provided lots of opportunity for divergent thinking, leadership, and compromise.

The cabins were judged, and groups were awarded points. Even better, Mrs. Pekarek has kept the point system going and students have continued to be motivated to keep earning them!

What a great way to meet the needs of her gifted students!


