## Testing ~ Norma Hayward

### **PSAT**

Students in grades 9-11 took the PSAT on Wednesday, October 10, 2018. Grade 9 took the PSAT 8/9 and Grades 10 and 11 took the PSAT/NMSQT. Scores for the class of 2020 determine which students are eligible to participate in the National Merit Scholarship Program. The PSAT and SAT have the same format and evaluate the same skills. Using personalized feedback based on test results, the PSAT provides students with a custom SAT study plan powered by Khan Academy. We expect to have results December 2018. ### **AP Exams**

AP exams are an essential part of the AP experience. Most colleges worldwide recognize AP in the admission process and accept successful exam scores for credit, advance placement, or both. Research shows that students who score a three or higher typically earn higher GPAs in college and have higher graduation rates. All students will take exams for AP courses taken at Stanton or Florida Virtual School (FLVS). Students enrolled or were previously enrolled in an AP class on FLVS need to inform me of exam(s) needed by email or stopping by my office in the media center. Students who miss an exam will pay the fee of \$94.00. Students not enrolled in a course who desire to take an exam or retake an exam must pay the fee of \$94.00 for each exam. ## Blue Ribbon & Bell Honors

## Guidance Updates ~ May Ibasco

### **Freshmen:**

Freshmen: Counselors will visit the 9th grade classes in October to provide a Freshman Survival Guide to help our 9th graders understand the expectations of colleges and the importance of their high school record. Grading scales, GPA's, transcripts of high school academic work, building a resume of activities and experiences, and beginning to identify what is important in a college choice, are some of the items covered.

### **Sophomores:**

Sophomores: School counselors will visit classrooms in the spring term. During the visit the counselors will cover graduation requirements, gpa's, college admission, and other information to help students become a college-ready scholar. Sophomores should check the class page and class news on the Stanton website.

### **Juniors:**

This is the year to start planning for college and scholarship applications that will be completed senior year. There will be a Junior Planning Meeting available to students with their counselors in the spring. It is highly encouraged that all students take advantage of this opportunity to help prepare for senior year. Simply visit [dcps.duvalschools.org/stanton](http://dcps.duvalschools.org/stanton) under the Students tab click the Junior Class page to get the information to schedule the meeting. Juniors should complete the college questionnaire and activities/experience form and request for an appointment. Please wait to receive an email from your counselor for a confirmation. Sending the request doesn't mean it's confirmed. The counselors will take appointments from February-April.

Juniors should also take the SAT and/or ACT at least once

this year. Go to [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org) to register for the SAT and [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) to register for the ACT.

### **Seniors:**

It's a busy time of the year for seniors. College application deadlines are coming and going (Oct 15, Nov 1, December 1, January 1, etc...). So far we have received and transmitted several transcript requests and they continue to come in. Seniors should also focus on searching for scholarships all year round. Students can check the Stanton website under Senior News for an updated scholarship list.

### **Bright Futures**

All seniors should complete the Florida Bright Futures application whether they are planning on staying in-state or going out-of-state. To apply visit: [www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org](http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org).

The application should take the students about 5-10 minutes to complete. Completing the application not only applies for Bright Futures but also to 20 other programs. Students should retain a copy of the application for their own records. Community service hours are required to meet eligibility:

Florida Academic (100 hours)

Florida Medallion (75 hours)

Hours must be submitted to Guidance by December if they want to meet the 1st round of evaluation. The 2nd deadline for submitting hours after spring break. To check Bright Futures eligibility visit: <https://www.floridashines.org>

In addition to fine-tuning these skills, juniors and seniors are in the process of creating plans that will help them reach their post-secondary goals. Students will continue to be pulled out of their elective classes for meetings, unless a specific request to meet is made by a student, parent or teacher. Before or after school meetings can be scheduled in advance.

ESE students will continue working towards their goals. Juniors and senior students will see an emphasis put on their transition to post-secondary education.
