Admission Requirements (visit duvalschools.org/landmark for more information):

- **Meeting the minimum requirements DOES NOT ensure placement in the Honors Academy**
- Completed application
- Completed student Flip Grid Assignment (rising **6th Graders**)
- Completed student One Pager Assignment (rising **7th & 8th Graders**)
- 2021 – 2022 Reading and Math FSA level combination of 3/4, 3/5, 4/4, 4/5, or 5/5
- 2021 – 2022 GPA 3.0 or higher

Application Process:

1. Complete the paper-based application and submit to Landmark Middle School (attention Honors Academy). You will need to download and save a copy of the application to your computer before completing it.
2. Review 2022 -2023 admission requirements which are in this document and on the Honors Academy page within the Landmark Middle School website <https://dcps.duvalschools.org/Page/14087>
3. If you are a rising **6th grader**, students will create the Flip Grid Assignment on: "What is leadership and honor at LMS?" A rubric can be found at the end of this application packet. Students need to sign in to their Microsoft account (Oneview) and submit their Flip Grid using the following link: <https://flipgrid.com/40918d14>
4. If you are a rising **7th or 8th grader**, students will create a One Pager Assignment on: "What Does Perseverance Mean to You?" using the rubric, found at the end of this application packet. The One Pager will be submitted to Mrs. Kellam for the Honors Academy team to review.
5. **DUE DATE: MAY 27, 2022** -- Complete and submit the application packet (including the Flip Grid / One Pager) to the Landmark Middle School office or to Mrs. Kellam. The application can be also be emailed to: kellama1@duvalschools.org

Program Requirements:

1. Students are required to maintain a minimum **2.5 GPA** with no D's and F's.
2. At least one hour each day at home should be planned for homework completion, study, and review. Some assignments and projects will require additional time.
3. Students are expected to maintain appropriate behavior and a positive attitude towards learning.
4. Students will have an Honors Academy Engagement Fee for supplies, materials, activities, and events. Specific details will be provided in the welcome packet.
5. Academic Honesty means that students complete all of their own work and do not attempt to take credit for something they did not produce. Plagiarism and cheating will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the program.

One Pager Instructions: This should be completed only by rising 7th and 8th Graders.

“What Does Perseverance Mean to You?”

A One-Pager is a creative response to your learning experience. It allows you to respond imaginatively while being brief and concise in making connections between words and images. We learn best when we create our own ideas. Your personal thinking about what you have experienced should be understood by the audience that views the One Pager.

Follow this rubric and format for your One Pager:

- Use unlined white paper (copy paper).
- Title the One-Pager appropriately to reflect the topic.
- Use colored pens, pencils, or markers.
- Fill the entire page.
- Use 3 visual images that relate to perseverance, either drawn or cut out from other sources. If you use a computer image, personalize it to make it your own.
- Place 5 essential vocabulary words/phrases that relate to “perseverance” around the images. These terms/words/phrases should express the main ideas, your impressions, feelings, or thoughts about what you think perseverance is.
- Include a personal connection how you can relate to perseverance.
- Write a summary main idea sentence that explains why perseverance would be important in the Honors Academy.
- Write 2 Costa’s (Level 2 or 3) questions about perseverance.
- Put a symbolic colored border around the edges of the page.
- Write your name on the back.
