Parent/Student Laptop Agreement

Duval County Public Schools is excited to implement a 1:1 computer initiative for all secondary students. It is our hope that the students/parents see this initiative an opportunity that will improve the educational experience. All students/parents participating in the 1:1 initiative must review and acknowledge the following expectations:

- The laptops are the property of the Duval County Public Schools unless otherwise notified.
 - o Each student will be responsible for the laptop and accessories that they have been assigned.
 - o Identification and inventory labels/tags have been placed on the laptop. These labels/tags should not be removed or modified.
 - o A student may not deface or destroy this property in any way. No stickers or personalization of the physical device or accessories are permitted.
 - o Laptop and accessories will be returned to the school when requested, upon the withdrawal from school, or the completion of the device lifecycle.
 - o Laptops that are not returned when a student leaves, transfers, or withdraws from school will be considered stolen.
- Equipment is solely for use by the student; no unauthorized person will have access to or use the device.
- Students will use the laptop responsibly and solely for educational purposes.
- Students will bring their laptop to school with them each day, secured in the case provided along with the power cord.
- Students may not install or use any software other than software owned by and/or approved by the school and/or District.
- No attempts should be made to modify or reconfigure the software image or configuration of the laptop.
- In accordance with federal regulations, the student's internet activity will be filtered to restrict access to inappropriate material.
- Students should contact their home school for any technical issue; loaner laptops are made available for students while their equipment is being repaired.
- Any activity on the laptop that is in violation of the District's Student Code of Conduct may result in the student losing his/her right to use the laptop and have all network privileges revoked.
- If the laptop and/or accessories are damaged or become inoperable, the student/parent may be responsible for paying for non - accidental damages or replacement/repair cost of the laptop or accessories. Multiple accidental damage issues will be considered abuse.
- If the device is stolen, the parent will notify the police and submit a copy of the report to their home school within 48 hours of the theft.
