Principal's Report

We are in the last stretch of instruction prior to state testing. We begin with ELA on May 2nd and with the exception of May 10th – TESTING FREE DAY – we are assessing one or more groups each day. We are working to space them out and make sure both students AND teachers are balanced and rested in between. Spring Budget looks good with only position being cut – math. We are a summer school site for both 8th and 12th grade retakes for promotion AND ESOL, so we should expect about 300 students on campus this summer.

We are in the process of camera installation, new front marquee and JROTC remodel. We are also going to have a full café remodel done this summer.

Graduation progress is at a slow point as we await ACT/SAT scores from the 48 seniors who are still in need of the reading concordant. We are almost 2% ahead of our place last year, but it is still very stressful.

We just had our FSCJ and J and J Orientation for our students moving into their junior and senior years — very exciting to see how far they have come in a short time and the opportunities available to them through the program. Up to 5 industry certifications AND the AS degree, all before they even receive their high school diploma.

The last weeks of school will be spent keeping our students and teachers positive, encouraging their current and next steps and starting the planning for the 1920 school year alongside summer school.

**Updates from Mr. Kevin Douglas-
