<p>Approve November 2019 SAC Minutes</p>	<p>Donald Lauro moved to approve the minutes and Vasco Eagle seconded the motion. Approval of the November Minutes.</p>
<p>District Advisory Council Updates</p>	<p>Meeting: 1/27 Meeting Focus: Mental Health/Full Service Schools Mr. Redman shared the following additional items shared at the meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State Legislature Bill 1079- Concerning having the School Superintendent become an elected position. • Bill 62- Sharing money with Charter Schools. • Bill 1400 – Teacher pay raises. <p>February 20, 2020 there will be a Principals and Pastors Breakfast at First Baptist Church in Downtown Jacksonville.</p> <p>Mr. Redman shared that one of the visitors at the meeting was upset about schools charging a walking fee for graduation. Ms. Bravo said this would not be a concern across the high schools as there are processes in place to take care of fees for students unable to afford the cost.</p>

Mid-Year Stakeholder's Report

Ms. Chirino, Assistant Principal, led the Mid-Year Stakeholder's Report.

After reviewing the school's mission and vision, school graduation simulation and 2020 targets were shared. Englewood should be at a very high "C" based on current calculations.

This year the ELA/Reading Proficiency Goal is 34%. FSA, PMA 1, PMA 2 and Achieve Data was shared.

Next Steps:

- Work on improving ACHIEVE Scores
- ACT/SAT course curriculum inclusion into 9th grade
- Additional ELL Support from the District
- Push-in/Pull-out support of 9th grade using mid-year data by AP Chirino.

The Math 2020 Proficiency Target is 42%
Currently we have a math coach and a math interventionist
Both Algebra 1 and Geometry offer double-blocked sections for level 2 and 3 students.

Next Steps:

- Push-in/Pull out support of Geometry students by AP Johnson.
- Math Coach co-teaching Alg Honors section
- Math Coach and Math Interventionist providing triangular small group model with all double-blocked sections on B days.
- AIT Mid-Year Pulls.

The Biology 2020 Proficiency Target is 55%.

Next Steps:

- Having weekly PLC meetings with Biology teachers with an emphasis on target students.
- Have a former Biology teacher push-into Biology classes once per week.
- Offer free after school tutoring

The US History 2020 Proficiency Target is 58%.

There are a rise in ISSP and Restorative Justice numbers this year. The increases in class 1 offenses were anticipated due to stronger implementation of the tardy policy and the increase in total school enrollment.
