<p>Approve October 2018 SAC Minutes</p>	<p>Motion to approve minutes and second made. Approved.</p> <p>Ms. Dykes- DJJ- Donna Collins DJJ Reform Specialist; will push to families of their clients to encourage Parent Academy attendance</p>
<p>District SAC Meeting Review</p>	<p>Meeting occurred on 11/26/18</p> <p>Mr. Redman had table of visitors introduce themselves. Then discussed the purpose and process behind District SAC meetings. Superintendent and school board member were not present. Feeder pattern discussed at the meeting. It has changed some over the year. We picked up a new school- our final elementary school feeders are: Holiday Hill, Love Grove, Spring Park, Hogan, Englewood, Greenfield Elementary.</p> <p>Prime Osborn Food Show showcasing local schools on December 11th around lunchtime</p> <p>Coming soon: Each school is going to have a kiosk- visitors will have to sign in with their ID in order to get a visitor's pass.</p>

	<p>Each high school will have a body metal detector. Position could be changed and have random searches. Metal wands will also be ordered.</p>
<p>EHS Guidance Team Presentation</p>	<p>Principal Bravo- wants to spotlight the Guidance Team and showcase the work that they do here at EHS such as scheduling, crisis, administrative work, teacher work, and mental health. Counselors at EHS roll-up with their cohort. Ms. Whitehouse (10th grade) and Ms. Ngo (11th grade) Video: "Under the Surface" Grade Level Meetings: Ms. Dykes- Showing video to students to show how all people are dealing with difficulties, "empathy is learned". Vision and Mission Statement from EHS Guidance Department Bravo- "It aligns to our school's mission and vision statement for the improvement plan this year." Basics overview of 4 counselors, 1 ELL specialist, 1 grad coach 1850 students, 450 ELLS, 174 ESE, 82 EC/EAs, eighty 504 plans (counselor updates), and 64 autism students 50% non-matriculation (500 enroll and 500 withdraw all year) By graduation, 70% will participate in acceleration Counselor domains: academic, college and career, social and emotional Annual events: multicultural fair, financial aid beacon, career fair, senior signing day, instant decision day, jax goes to college week, early college recruitment night, school choice expo, annual credit checks, grade level parent meetings</p> <p>Focus tonight: Grade level meetings- happens monthly 25 teachers per grade level + a counselor and admin; started last year; focus on red-flag students (who were retained, attendance, discipline, GPA, testing requirements, ESE, ELL, personal and/or family challenges)</p> <p>Ms. Whitehouse shared an example of the past meeting; she shared a video with active conversations; teachers at this meeting "adopted" a student to learn more about them and support individual red flag students.</p> <p>You mentioned there were about 100- does that mean there are 100 red flag students for the 10th grade? Yes in regards to students with a GPA below a 2.0 we do have 100/500 red flag.</p>

Ms. Ngo then shared an example of the past meeting; last month we focused on AIT- teachers called home to set up meetings with parents of students who had very low attendance; red flag students follow-up with mentor teachers who adopted them last year; Dean Boyd, Ms. Ngo, and Ms. Johnson had a full day AIT initiative. Positive initiative with attendance ATTEND and ACHIEVE. Positive initiative with teacher nominations with RAMS PBIS motto.

We have preplanning meetings to share our “ideas” before rolling it out to the teachers at the grade level meetings. This planning is to provide an intentional and successful meeting with the teachers in order to best serve that cohort. AP and counselor collaborate with full autonomy. Bravo spoke about how her team goes above and beyond with the planning. Ngo spoke about the success stories that different students have had in order

Whitehouse- discipline updates from Deans; overall referrals are down by over 100 from last year- persistent and consistent stress we put on behavioral expectations.

203 Full Service referrals from EHS from August to October.

District Wide Mental Health Initiative

9th grade counselor is over this piece, Ms. Radford.

9th grade year students can participate in a mental health screening; offered in 4 languages; screening started at EHS last week. 26% of the students who have been screened have indicated self-harm. 45/171 students who were screened indicated self-harm. 3 students “Christmas treed” the screener. 2 calls were made to the crisis team.

1 in 4 have a mental health issue which validates the survey at 26% who stated they have thought about self-harm.

Questions:

Alison- how do we follow-up with the 45 students that have indicated self-harm.

Ngo- Each situation is very specific; if a student is baker-acted we are told when they are released so we can follow up; students are questioned through meeting with students one-on-one; full service referrals

Redman and Bravo spoke to how it was a great initiative; politically it is on the radar even for adults
