INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB): The IB program is an internationally recognized, rigorous, pre-university liberal arts course of study that meets the needs of highly motivated and academically oriented secondary students. Beyond intellectual rigor and high academic standards, strong emphasis is placed on the ideals of international understanding and responsible citizenship.

Stanton's IB Program, started in 1983, was one of the first diploma programs in the state of Florida. Over one third of Stanton's student population is enrolled in the IB program. Worldwide, approximately 85% of the candidates attempting to earn the diploma are successful. At Stanton our success rate in earning the diploma is consistently around 85-90%. COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS: Jacksonville population (2023) 973,047: 59.4% White; 30.7% Black; 7.7% Hispanic; 4.3% Asian; median household income - \$74,873; wholesale/retail trade and personal/health/hospitality services comprise 69% of employment activity; location is Northeast Florida; Jacksonville is the largest city in the contiguous US in square miles and encompasses all of Duval County; the 10th largest in population.

DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM: 110 elementary, 26 middle, 23 secondary, 8 alternative schools, 3 exceptional education centers, 21 charter schools.

STANTON COLLEGE PREPARATORY SCHOOL: opened in 1981 as Duval County's first magnet school. 2023-2023 enrollment: 9th - 394 10th - 338 11th - 338 12th - 324 Total - 1394

The mission of the school is to provide a rigorous academic program of all advanced academic courses supplemented by philanthropic, artistic, and forensic activities; accredited by the Florida State Department of Education and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Member of the National Association of College Admission Counseling and complies with the NACAC Statement of Principles of Good Practice.

GRADING SYSTEM: A (Excellent) = 90 - 100; B (Very Good) = 80 - 89; C (Average) = 70 - 79; D (Unsatisfactory) = 60 - 69; F (Failing) < 60. Gpa scale is 1-4 for unweighted and 1-5 for weighted.

CLASS RANK: Decile: calculated at the end of the junior year, using grades 9 -11, or six semesters, and at the end of the 4th quarter of 12th; determined by grade point average using marks earned in all subjects taken; advanced, honors, IB, and AP courses are weighted with one additional point: A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, F=0; standard courses: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0.
