MID-YEAR STAKEHOLDERS' ASSESSMENT Duval County Public Schools

Overview:

The Mid-Year Stakeholders' Assessment for **John Stockton Elementary** was held on **2/6/2020**. The meeting was facilitated by **Regan Thoresen and Stephanie Brannan**. Identified community stakeholders, which included, if applicable, members of the School Advisory Council, PTA/PTSA president or designee, DTU representative, shared decision making representative, school-based booster and alumni organizations, business partners of the school, faith-based partners of the school, non-profit representatives that partner with the school, philanthropic donors that support the school, and the NAACP education committee chair or designee.

This report includes a compilation of the community stakeholders' comments regarding "what matters most" to support student academic achievement in the school.

The following process has been designed to be easy to prepare by using summaries and selected performance examples that focus on five school improvement steps:

- **Needs Assessment** - *Summarize the student academic achievement needs and the relationship to the school improvement plan.*

iReady Reading- KG-2nd grade has shown some great improvements. Kindergarten had a 54% increase (of students who were proficient from fall to winter). 1st grade had a 28% increase from fall to winter and 2nd grade had a 31% increase from fall to winter. Not all 3rd-5th grade students take the reading iReady however the overall percentage for 3rd-5th graders meeting proficiency went from 33% in the fall to 51% in the winter.

iReady Math- The math data does not demonstrate the rate of success I would like to see. The difference between students demonstrating proficiency in the fall to the winter was: KG- 48% increase, 1st grade- 32% increase and 2nd grade has a 22% increase. 3rd grade went from 17-47% which is a 29% increase. 4th grade went from 27-52% which is a 25% increase and 5th grade went from 43-58% which is a 15% increase. When we compare data from last year at this time to this year at the same time, we have seen decreases in several grade levels. KG and 3rd are down by 3%, 4th grade is down by 9% and 2nd grade is down by 22%. However, 1st grade is up by 4% and 5th grade is up by 7%.

Achieve- We have made slow progress in the area of Achieve for 3rd-5th grade reading. In the fall, we had 42% of our students who were listed as Proficient and 50% during the winter administration.

PMA ELA- During the mid- year administration of the PMA more than half of our students in 3rd through 5th grade were showing on grade level with another 30-45% showing progressing toward meeting the standard. Less than 10% in each of the 3 grade levels are showing below target.

PMA Math- Our data was a bit lower in the area of math especially in 4th and 5th grade. 3rd grade had 77% on grade level, while 4th grade had 42% and 5th grade had 58%. However, upon further discussion with 4th and 5th grade teachers, there were a few standards that had not yet been taught at the time of the assessment.

- **School Improvement Plan** – *What will be done to address the identified academic achievement needs?*
 - Small group push in support from admin in math (3rd & 4th)
 - After school book club with 4th & 5th graders (admin)
 - After school tutoring for 3rd -5th grade ELA and Math
 - Computer lab 2x per week before school
 - Students tracking their own data (in some cases down to the standard)
 - Admin data chats with students and teachers
 - Teachers & admin creating plans for teachers (K-5)
 - Individualized student work folders (ELA & Math)
- **Community and Family Engagement and Involvement** – *What are the examples of community engagement and involvement that the stakeholders are aware? What are examples of parent engagement and involvement?*

- **Evaluation of Results** – *How has the committee evaluated the effectiveness of the actions taken? What process has been used, who has been involved, and what specific criteria or indicators of success have been used to evaluate the effectiveness of the action?*

The School Advisory Committee had our annual Mid-Year Stakeholders Meeting where any and all members were invited. The principal went through explaining the data including but not limited to: what assessments were used, when they were administered, comparison data from beginning of the year to midyear as well as last year to this year. After the data was provided and other info was presented, the principal opened up to what are we doing well and what can we do better. The principal also shared they could send it via email to her or the SAC Chair.

- **Next Steps** – *Where do we go from here?*

We have already started implementing all of the strategies listed above under School Improvement Plan. We have also begun taking parent suggestions and will be meeting with our shared decision making team as to how to implement them for next year.
