

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR FIGHTING



1. FIGHTING WILL NOT BE TOLERATED IN OUR SCHOOLS

STUDENTS THAT HAVE ISSUES WITH OTHER STUDENTS NEED TO SPEAK TO ADMINISTRATION SO THAT THE SITUATION CAN BE RESOLVED BEFORE ESCULATING

2. STUDENTS THAT VIOLATE FIGHTING INFRACTIONS WILL BE PENALIZED BASED OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT WHICH INCLUDES SUSPENSION FROM SCHOOL or PLACEMENT AT AN ALTERNATIVE CENTER

3. There are Higher Penalties for students that participate in an altercation with multiple participants/students.

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR FIGHTING



- 1st Occurrence Fight 1-3 Days OSS and Restorative Practice before return to school
- 2nd Occurrence Fight 3-5 Days OSS and Restorative Practice before return to school
- 3rd Occurrence *Fight 7 Days OSS School Discretion to refer to Hearing Office*

Multiple Participants Fights Up to 7 Days Out of School Suspension and refer to Hearing Office

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR DRUGS

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WRITTEN THREATS



836.10 Written threats to kill, do bodily injury, or conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism; punishment; exemption from liability.

- Any person who writes or composes and also sends or procures the sending of any letter, inscribed communication, or electronic communication, whether such letter or communication be signed or anonymous, to any person, **containing a threat to kill or to do bodily injury to the person** to whom such letter or communication is sent, or a **threat to kill or do bodily injury to any member of the family** of the person to whom such letter or communication is sent, or any person who makes, posts, or transmits a threat in a writing or other record, including an electronic record, **to conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism**, in any manner that would allow another person to view the threat, **commits a felony of the second degree**, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.775.083, or s. 775.084.

BOMB THREATS



4.08 (DOC) **Bomb Threats – Reporting to school district employees or agents, police, or fire officials the presence of a bomb on or near school property with a reasonable belief that a bomb is actually present. Also giving a false report concerning planting a bomb, an explosive, or a weapon of mass destruction, or concerning the use of firearms in a violent manner; penalty.
(Pursuant to Florida Statute 790.163)

ANY STUDENT COMMITTING A BOMB THREAT WILL RESULT IN POSSIBLE EXPULSION

SCHOOL WIDE THREAT



3.26 - School Wide Threat - Reporting to school or district personnel or agent immediate school wide **threat which causes serious disruption to the educational environment** in which law enforcement had to be notified and threat assessment had to be performed to include but not limited to threats to shoot school/officials with the action actuality able to be carried out. Investigation with threat assessment must be presented to the Hearing Office CCR # Required.

- **Special Note:** Senate Bill 7026 any student who is determined to have made a threat or false report must be referred to mental health services identified by the school district for evaluation or treatment, when appropriate.

MONITORING PROTOCOLS FOR SAFETY



- WE WILL PERFORM RANDOM SEARCHES OF CLASSROOMS AND BUSES ROUTINELY

CODE RED - LOCKDOWN



- Secure all pods/gallery doors
- Classroom doors to remain locked at all times
- Turn off lights
- TURN OFF ALL CELLPHONES
- Cover all large windows
- Door window is to remain uncovered
- Sit on the floor out of sight of windows - do not lean on folding walls
- DO NOT OPEN YOUR CLASSROOM DOOR DURING A LOCKDOWN - THIS INCLUDES FOR YOUR STUDENTS
- Admin and police will use keys for entry

CODE RED - LOCKDOWN



P.E. Classes:

Those in the gym should sit on the floor in front of bleachers away from the windows. Gym doors should be locked and windows covered. Those on the basketball/tennis courts should enter gym through the locker room doors and follow gym procedures. Those on the field should go into the Field House locker rooms.

Drivers Ed:

If on the range during a lockdown, report to the gym.

Lunch Room:

If students are at lunch when a lockdown is called, all students should be swept into the cafeteria and sit on the floor. Blinds should be lowered and doors locked.

CODE RED - LOCKDOWN



If students are on a hall pass during a Lockdown Procedure:

Lockdown in the closest bathroom. Keep the door locked. Do not open it for anyone.

Administration will sweep students to designated safe areas:

Smiley - Building 1 Media Center/Clinic

Moses & Copeland - Building 2 Chorus Room, Gym or Café

George - Building 3 nearest classroom or Manta House

McMahon - Building 5 - nearest classroom

Smith - Building 6 - nearest classroom

CODE YELLOW - SHELTER IN PLACE

- Remain in class
- Ensure classroom doors are locked
- Large windows should be covered
- Door windows remain uncovered
- Increase situational awareness
- ZERO hall passes, don't even ask
- Continue instruction
- Follow all instructions

P.E. Classes:

Those in the gym should be seated in the bleachers until an announcement is made. Those in the basketball/tennis court or field should be gathered together in one general area and listen for announcements.

Drivers Ed:

If on the range, students should be gathered in one general area and listen for announcements.

Lunch Room:

All students should be escorted into the cafeteria and continue with lunch.

Students out on a hall pass during a Code Yellow

Quickly return back to your classroom if the student is in the halls. If the student is in an office or another teacher's classroom, remain in the office/classroom until the Code Yellow has been lifted.
