#### **School Improvement Plan Review**

- ADPD One ADPD per month will be dedicated to peer walk throughs using the school rubric for instructional delivery.
- APDP during weeks 2 and/or 3 coaches and administrators will meet with all teachers to review their student data and set goals. Information from this meeting will be used to write IPDPs.
- APDP One ADPD per month will be dedicated to analyzing data. Teachers will prepare an action plan to address the following areas – Pacing and Target Student Standard deficiency based on assessment results.
- Teachers will track tiered groups of students using individual student data folders that will be updated biweekly and discussed with Admin and Coach (during PLCs).
- The teachers will work during common planning and early release to create lessons that involve explicit instruction, modeling, and differentiated activities for stations/rotations. Lesson plans will be checked quarterly by administration and feedback provided to the teachers.
- Grade Level PLC will take place once a month during Early Release days.







Are girls have shown GREAT improvement, discipline referrals continue to decrease.


Discipline is trending up for whole school. Our ESE population requires additional attention ASAP.

75% or Higher on 1st Try




